Costa Rica boasts coastlines on both the Caribbean Sea and the Pacific Ocean. Your major resorts in Costa Rica are located along the Golfo de Papagayo in Guanacaste, a Costa Rican province that's located in the northwestern part of the



country along the Pacific Ocean just south of Nicaragua. The Guanacaste province covers an area of nearly 4,000 square miles and is the most sparsely populated province in all of Costa Rica. The province acquired its name from the Guanacaste tree which is also referred to as the ear pod tree and is the national tree of Costa Rica. The Guanacaste area is less tropical, humid and exuberant than the rest of the country. Its plains and dry forests can sometimes remind one of the African savannah landscape. The province is very rich in geography and has spectacular mountains and volcanoes. On the east end of the province, a group of green swathed volcanoes act as a bind and form the *cordillera de Guanacaste* and *cordillera de Tilaran*. These steep and beautiful mountains have tumbling rivers which flow down to the flatlands and form a vast plain.



The province consists of very beautiful pristine beaches along with its chain of lovely volcanoes, which make it a very favorable tourist destination. The province definitely has a variety of outdoor activities like hiking, golf, bird-watching, boating, cultural activities, snorkeling, sea kayaking, diving,

horseback riding, surfing, sport-fishing, and many more activities that have not been mentioned. Tourists are also attracted by the wide variety of wildlife and exotic plants which are quite fascinating and can be seen in the national parks. The national parks which are found in the province of Guanacaste harbor different species of animals and ancient caves plus other exciting features which will definitely excite you when you go and visit them. They include:

- Barra Honda National Park: This national park has a lot to offer to tourists and features caves which are very old and are made of limestone. This makes it a very ideal place to visit if you are interested caves.
- Curu National Wildlife Refuge: This is also a wildlife conservancy found in the province. It is a privately owned nature reserve that is perfect for bird watching and wildlife watching as well.
- Las Baulas National Marine Park: This marine park is a very unique park that features the pacific oceans



largest turtle colony. This will definitely be a once in a lifetime experience for you, a highly recommended activity.

- Rincon de la Vieja National Park: This national park is located around 15 miles east of the capital of Guanacaste which is Liberia. This park carries with it an abundance of wildlife, waterfalls that are to-die-for, and volcanoes which are active.
- Guanacaste National Park: This is also a very interesting place to visit. It is located about just northeast of the province Turrialba and is a very good place especially for picnics. The purpose of this park was to spread environmental awareness to the locals of Costa Rica and the province of Guanacaste in particular.







One of the easiest ways to get to Guanacaste is to fly into the Daniel Oduber International Airport (LIR) in Liberia, the Provincial capital. Also close to the resort area is the Santa Cruz, Costa Rica, Guanacaste Airport (SZC). Taxis are pretty cheap

and when you have a city official taxi, that's the fastest, cheapest, and safest way of transportation. Getting around by bus is the slowest manner of transportation but you'll find it to be scenic and cheap to get around locally. You can of course rent a car to drive as long as you have a valid driver's license plus a passport. Usually you are required to get rental insurance. The roads are not the best to drive in some places. If you are willing to spend a bit to save time, you could fly domestically on small aircraft and hop to different points in the country and cut your time of travel by road quite a bit. This is a popular way of local travel among tourists who really want to see different parts of the small country.







So, when's the best time to go to Costa Rica? There are really only 2 seasons in Costa Rica: Dry and Wet. Costa Rica is only 10 degrees north from the equator, making the climate hot mostly all year round. The months from mid-November through



the end of April are typically the dry months, and the high tourist season. The climate in the Guanacaste province of Costa Rica is unique. This is because the province gets less rain and consistent heat during the tourist season. This dry heat is a major tourist attraction especially during the North American and European winter. The remainder of the year is typically your rainy low-tourism season. Between May and October, the climate that is experienced in

this province is showers daily with moderate temperatures. Still a great place to visit in the off season to experience it right after a shower.



Not only is the province renowned for its great weather, beached, hotels and resorts but the restaurants in the area that serve great food are plenty. The provincial capital of Guanacaste is referred to as Liberia and here you will find a host of world class restaurants as well as fine casual

dining that is simply outstanding food. Most big towns along the coast also host very good restaurants for any budget. This is because fresh seafood is plentiful and quite popular in Guanacaste with most restaurants having menus on seafood. Areas like the Golfo de Papagayo, Tamarindo, Playa Samara and Playa Nosara, all have very good restaurants around the beach area. Hotels and resorts usually play host to most of the good 5-star restaurants in the province. Just ask the locals what is good and you will get great recommendations.
