In Midtown Manhattan you'll find such top attractions at Time Square, Broadway, Fifth Avenue shopping, Rockefeller Center, Central Park and more. You'll find plenty of entertainment, nightlife, dining and great bars & clubs.



Time Square is famous for its traditional New Year's Eve ball drop and being the hub for Broadway Theaters. Time Square is named after the old New York Times Building at One Time Square. Time Square is not really a square but rather a large


intersection where Broadway and Seventh Avenues cross between 42nd and 47th Streets. The Square is often referred to as "the cross roads of the world." Time Square was the starting point for the old Lincoln Highways that stretched all the way to Golden Gate Park in San Francisco. The intersection is adorned with large towering illuminated digital signage and neon lighting. Here you'll find the NASDAQ offices, Broadway show ticket kiosks, and the convenient Time Square subway station. The Square is also home to ABC's studios. There is always plenty of activity around Time Square so it' a great place to people watch and take in the energy.

Broadway shows are always a huge attraction to tourists and locals. Around 1 billion in show tickets are sold annually. There're approximately 40 large theaters specializing in theatrical performances in the Broadway theater district around Time Square.



Musicals and stage plays run throughout the week (except Mondays) and there are usually some matinee shows available. The TKTS booths in Time Square sell discounted same day tickets and matinee tickets. The annual Tony Awards recognize live theater performances. Broadway is where you'll find many of these award winning shows. The larger Broadway theaters include the George Gershwin Theatre, the Hilton Theater, the Palace Theater, and the Broadway Theater. If you get a change be sure to take in a Broadway show while visiting New York City.





Rockefeller Center is a 22 acre commercial complex in the heart of Midtown between Fifth and Seventh Avenues and 48th and 51st Streets. The Center is the home of The Radio City Music Hall, The GE (General Electric) Building and the NBC studios and Fox News Channel. The Art Deco Radio City Music Hall seats 6000 people and was once boasted as the largest theater in the world. Featured on the TV show "30

Rock" the GE Building (formerly the RCA Building) at 30 Rockefeller Center is 70-stories. The skyscraper is the home of "Saturday Night Live" and other popular live NBC shows. A popular tourist destination is the observation deck on the 70th floor known as "The Top of the Rock." It's one of the most spectacular 360-degree views of the city next to the view from The Empire State Building. The center plaza at the front of 30 Rock is home to the famous ice skating rink, bronze statue of Prometheus, and annual Christmas tree lighting.

Central Park is an 843-acre urban park sitting directly in the center of Manhattan. Completed in 1873 the Park is a Natural Historic Landmark. The park is the most visited park in the United States with over 25-million visitors annually. The Park is located between 59th and 110th Street and Fifth and



Eighth Avenues. The park features two ice skating rinks, the Central Park Zoo, Conservatory Garden, several lakes and ponds, 37 playgrounds, ball fields, sculptures, fountains, outdoor theater, walking tracks, historic carousel, natural woods, wildlife, lawn areas and the Strawberry Fields Memorial to singer & song writer John Lennon. Central Park is a great place to get out of the hustle and bustle of the city without leaving the city. The Park is truly a beautiful place that should not be missed when visiting New York City.



Located at West 34th Street and Fifth Avenue you can't miss the famous art deco 102-story Empire State Building. Completed in 1931, the Empire State Building was the tallest building in the world and now remains the tallest building in New York after the tragic 911 attack on the World Trade Center. The Empire State Building has been featured in many films and television shows throughout the years. A popular

tourist destination is the indoor and outdoor observation deck on the 86th floor offering a spectacular 360-degree view of the city. There is also a smaller indoor observation deck on the 102nd floor. If you want to visit the observation deck be patient, lines can be very long. You will get great photos of the city so don't forget your camera.

Other Midtown attractions include Carnegie Hall, Grand Central Station, the Chrysler Building, the New York City Public Library, Madison Square Garden, Fifth Avenue shopping, and plenty of museums.

For the museum and art enthusiast, New York City is a Mecca of museums and art venues of every kind. There is even a sex museum and a Girl Scout Museum. Among the more popular New York City Museums you'll find the Metropolitan Museum of



Art (the Met), The Guggenheim, the American GUGGENHEIM MUSEUM Museum of Natural History, and the Museum of Modern Art (MoMa). At the Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts you'll find the Metropolitan Opera House, New York City Ballet, New York City Opera and the New York Philharmonic. New York City is a world center of culture comparable to no other.



South of Midtown on the lower west side of Manhattan you'll find Greenwich Village (The Village). The Village is home to New York University and Washington Square Park. Within the Village the street names are no longer numbered and

lose their typical grid pattern. You'll find narrow streets with odd angles. The Village is known for its Bohemian culture, Beatniks, young artists, nightclubs, coffee houses, performing arts and experimental Of-Off-Broadway Theater. Greenwich Village is home to many celebrities and has been featured in many films and television, including "Friends," "Barney Miller," and "Sex and the City."

Further south you'll find lower Manhattan and the downtown financial district. The area features such attractions as Wall Street, the former World Trade Center's Ground Zero, the South Street Seaport, Battery Park, the Staten Island Ferry, a picturesque



view of the Statue of Liberty, and the Brooklyn Bridge. A stop at Wall Street is a great place for a power lunch after visiting the New York Stock Exchange in the morning to experience the energy. The South Street Seaport is a historic area on the East River at Fulton Street. It boasts some of the oldest renovated commercial buildings in Manhattan. The Seaport features shopping, restaurants and nightlife. If you visit Battery Park and want to get a better free view of the Statue of Liberty you can hop on the Staten Island Ferry for free. The ferry ride to Staten Island lakes around 20-minutes and will give you a close view of the Statue and Ellis Island. Otherwise you can just take a Ferry directly to the Statue and take a tour.



A great guided tour of Manhattan Island is taking a Circle Line Island Cruise around the island. The Full-Island 3-Hour Cruise will take you around the entire island, under 7 major bridges, through 5 boroughs, past more than 25 landmarks and provide an up close view of the Statue of Liberty. You can also take the shorter 2-hour Semi-Circle Cruise through lower and Midtown Manhattan taking in the Statue of Liberty, United Nations Headquarters and Brooklyn Bridge. If you are pressed for time you can do the 75-Minute Liberty Cruise and simply take in the Statue of Liberty and the harbor.

Other New York City attraction and points of interest include Coney Island, the Bronx Zoo, Yankee Stadium, St. Patrick Cathedral, the Ellis Island Immigration Museum, and the neighborhoods of Chinatown and SoHo. The lesser known attractions are simply endless. For example, some of the City's restaurants, nightclubs and deli's are famous hot spots.
